An Act for the Governing of Negroes.

WHEREAS the Plantations and Estates of this Island cannot be fully Preamble. managed, and brought into Ufe, without the Labour and Service of great Numbers of Negroes and other Slaves: And forafmuch as the faid Negroes and other Slaves brought unto the People of this Island for that purpole, are of Barbarous, Wild, and Savage Natures, and fuch as renders them wholly unqualified to be governed by the Laws, Cuftoms, and Practices of our Nations: It therefore becoming abfolutely neceffary, that fuch other Conftitutions, Laws, and Orders should be in this Island framed and enacted for the good Regulating and Ordering of them, as may both reftrain the Diforders, Rapines, and Inhumanities to which they are naturally prone and inclined, with fuch Encouragements and Allowances as are fit and needful to their Support; that from both, this Ifland, through the Bleffing of God thereon, may be preferved, His Majesty's Subjects in their Lives and Fortunes fecured, and the Negroes and other Slaves be well provided for, and guarded from the Cruelties and Infolencies of themfelves or other ill-tempered People or Owners: To which Purpose, Be it Enacted and Ordained by the Right Honourable Edwin Stede, His Majesty's Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief of this and other the Charibbee Iflands, the Honourable the Council, and General Affembly of this Ifland, and by Authority of the fame, That no Mafter, Mistrefs, Commissioner, or Overseer of any Family in this Island, shall give their Negroes or other Slaves leave on Sabbath-days, Holy-days, or any other time, to go out of their Plantations, except fuch Negro or other Slave as ufually wait upon them at Home or Abroad, and wearing a Livery; and no other Negro or Slave, except with a Ticket under the Master or Mistres's Hand, or fome other Perfon by his or her Appointment, fpecifying the time allowed for his or her Return, upon Pain of forfeiting for every Negro or other Slave, fo licenfed to go Abroad, Two Shillings and Six Pence Sterling; Half of the faid Fine to be to the Informer, and the other to the Publick Treasury. And if any Mafter, Miftrefs, Commiffioner, or Overfeer of a Plantation, shall find any Negro or other Slave in their Plantation at any time without a Ticket, or Business from his faid Master, and doth not apprehend them, or endeavour fo to do; and having apprehended them, shall not punish them with a moderate Whipping, thall forfeit Ten Shillings Sterling, to be disposed of as aforefaid.

AND for that as it is absolutely necessary to the Safety of this Place, that all due Care be taken to reftrain the Wandrings and Meetings of Negroes and other Slaves at all times, more especially on Saturday Nights, Sundays, and other Holy-days, and their using and carrying of Clubs, Wooden Swords, or other milchievous and dangerous Weapons, or using or keeping of Drums, Horns, or other loud Inftruments, which may call together, or give Sign or Notice to one another of their wicked Defigns and Purpofes; and that all Masters, Overseers, and others, may be encouraged and enjoyned diligently and carefully to prevent the fame, Be it Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That it shall be lawful for all Masters, Overseers, and other Persons whatsoever, to apprehend and take up any Negro or other Slave, that shall be found out of the Plantation of his or their Master or Owner at any time, especially on Saturday Nights, Sundays, or other Holy-days, not being on lawful Bufinels, and with a Letter from their Master, or a Ticket, or not having a White Man with them (except only fuch Negroes or other Slaves as ufually attend their Masters, and have on a Livery) and the faid Negro, or other Slave or Slaves, correct by a moderate Whipping; and after Notice given to their Master.

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Master, Owner, or Overseer, him or them detain, until the faid Master, Owner, or Overfeer pay to the faid Perfon that took him up, Two Shillings and Six Pence for every fuch Negro or other Slave, he making Oath before the next Justice of the Peace (if thereunto required) by the Owner of fuch Negro or other Slave, that he found or faw no Letter or Ticket with him; as also any Negro, or other Slave or Slaves, met or found out of the Plantation of his or their Master or Mistres, though with a Letter or Ticket, if he or they be armed with fuch Clubs, or other offenfive Weapons aforefaid, him or them fo difarmed, take up and whip, and fhall receive the fame Reward, as aforefaid, from the Mafter or Owner of fuch Negro, or other Slave or Slaves; and whatfoever Master, Owner, or Overseer shall permit or suffer his or their Negro, or other Slave or Slaves, at any time hereafter to beat Drums, blow Horns, or use any other loud Instruments, and shall not cause his Negro-Houses once every Week to be diligently fearched, and fuch Inftruments, if any be found, caufe to be burned; or whofoever shall fuffer and countenance any publick Meeting or Feafting of strange Negroes or other Slaves in their Plantations, shall forfeit Fifty Shillings Sterling for every fuch Offence, upon Conviction or Proof, as aforefaid : Provided an Information or other Suit be commenced within One Month after Forfeiture thereof for the fame.

AND be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That every Overfeer of a Family in this Island shall cause all his Negro-Houses to be searched diligently and effectually once every Fourteen Days for Fugitive and Run-away Slaves, Clubs, Wooden Swords, and other milchievous Weapons; and finding any fo, to take them away, and caufe them to be burned; as alfo for Clothes, Goods, and any other Things and Commodities that are not given them by their Master, Mistres, Commander, or Overseer, and honeftly come by; in whole Cuftody they find any thing of that kind, and fulpect or know to be ftoln Goods, the fame they shall feize and take into their Custody; and a full and ample Defcription of the Particulars thereof in Writing, within Six Days after the Discovery thereof, to send to the Clerk of the Parish for the time being, who is hereby required to receive the fame, and to enter upon it the Day of its Receipt, and the Particulars to file and keep to himfelf; and thall fet upon the Posts of the Church-Door a short Brief that such lost Goods are found, whereby any Perfon that hath loft his Goods may the better come to the Knowledge where they are, by further enquiring for stoln Goods, until he shall first declare what he hath lost, and the Marks and Descriptions thereof, and paid him Twelve Pence for the fame; by which, if the Clerk shall be convinced, that any part of the Goods certified to him to be found, appertains to the Party enquiring, he is to direct the faid Party enquiring to the Place and Party where his Goods be, who is hereby required to make Reflitution of what is in being to the true Owner, upon the Penalties of the Forfeitures of Twenty Shillings Sterling for every Neglect by the Overfeer or Clerks aforefaid, in any of the Particulars aforefaid.

AND for the more effectual detecting and punifhing fuch Perfons that trade with any Slaves for ftoln Goods, Be it further Enacted, That where any Perfon fhall be fulpected to trade, as aforefaid, any Two Juffices of the Peace, or the Juffices of the Quarter-Seffions of the Peace, fhall have Power to take from him fufficient Recognizance not to trade with any Slaves contrary to the Laws of this Ifland; and if it fhall afterwards appear to the Juffices of the Quarter-Seffions, that fuch Perfon hath, or hath had, or fhipped off any Goods fulpected to be unlawfully come by, fuch Perfon being called before the Juffices at the next Quarter-Seffions following, fhall there be obliged to make reafonable Proof of whom he bought, or how he came by the faid Goods; and unlefs he do it, his Recognizance fhall be forfeited.

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A $_{N D}$ be it further Enacted and Ordained, That if any Negro or Slave whatfoever fhall offer any Violence to any Chriftian, by Striking, or the like, fuch Negro or other Slave fhall, for his or her first Offence, by Information given upon Oath to the next Justice, be feverely whipped by the Constable, by Order of the faid Justice; For his fecond Offence of that nature, by Order of the Justice of Peace, he shall be feverely whipped, his Nose flit, and be burned in some part of his Face with a hot Iron; And for his third Offence he shall receive, by Order of the Governor and Council, such greater Punishment as they shall think meet to inflict.

PROVIDED always, That fuch Striking or Conflict be not in the lawful Defence of their Mafters, Miftreffes, or Owners of their Families, or of their Goods.

A N D it is hereby further Enacted, That all the Slaves within this Ifland fhall have Clothes once every Year (that is to fay) Drawers and Caps for Men, and Petticoats and Caps for Women, upon Pain of forfeiting Five Shillings for each Slave that fhall not be clothed, as aforefaid, One Third to the Informer, the other Two Thirds to His Majefty, for the Ufe of the Poor of the Parifh where the Offender liveth.

A N D it is further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all Perfons who fhall hereafter take up any Run-away or Fugitive Negro, or other Slave or Slaves, not knowing the Mafter or Owner of fuch Negro or Slave, and fhall bring them unto the Provoft Marfhal, or his Deputy, fhall receive Ten Shillings Sterling from the Treafurer for the time being, who is hereby appointed to pay the fame : And in cafe he fhall refufe to make the faid Payment upon Prefentment of the faid Negro, or other Slave or Slaves, and thereof Oath to be made before any Juftice of the Peace, the faid Juftice is hereby authorized and required to direct his Warrant to any Conftable, to caufe the Value thereof to be immediately levied out of the Goods of the faid Treafurer, and the faid Goods to be delivered to the faid Party. And the Negroes fo brought, fhall be kept in the Cage at the Stepping-Stones by the Provoft Marfhal, and not in Goal; which faid Cage is always to be kept in fufficient Repair, at the publick Charge of this Ifland.

A N D be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That it fhall and may be lawful for the faid Provoft Marthal to retain and keep in his Cuftody, as aforefaid, the Body of all fuch Run-aways, until the Owner of them fhall pay unto the faid Treafurer Eleven Shillings Sterling; and alfo unto the faid Provoft Marthal Four Pence for every Four and twenty Hours the faid Fugitive Slave hath been in his Cuftody, and alfo until he have a Difcharge under the Hand of the faid Treafurer, or his Clerk. And the Turn-key fhall receive Six Pence for every Negro delivered.

PROVIDED always, That the faid Provoft Marshal do furnish the faid Negroes and other Slaves with sufficient Food and Drink, which is to be proved upon Oath, if by the Owner of the Negro or other Slaves it shall be fo required to be done.

A N D it is further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any of the faid Slaves fhall die for want of Food, the faid Provoft Marshal shall be responfible for them to the Owners: And if the faid Marshal suffer any Slave to escape before he be duly delivered by a Discharge in Writing under the Hand of the abovefaid Treasurer, the Provost Marshal shall pay unto him the aforefaid Treafurer, Eleven Shillings, and shall make further Satisfaction to the Owner, as by the Governor and Council shall be thought fit: And if the faid Provost Marshall shall suffer any Slave to be otherwise employed out of the Cage before due Delivery, as aforefaid, he shall forfeit for each Slave sterling.

AND

AND be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all fuch Perfons as shall apprehend and bring down any Run-away Slave or Slaves to St. Michael's Town unto the Treasurer for the time being, or to the Cage, shall, upon fuch bringing down of fuch Run-away Slave or Slaves, deliver upon Oath to the faid Treasurer, or in case of his Sickness or Absence, to any Justice of the Peace, to be by him returned to the Treasurer's Office (before he shall receive the Confideration before appointed) an Account of his Name and Place of Abode, with the Time when, and Place where he apprehended fuch Fugitive Slave or Slaves; and that he knew of no Ticket the Negro had, nor the Owner of fuch Negro or Slave, which the faid Treafurer is hereby required to take and enter into a Book, to the intent that all Owners of Slaves may come to the right Knowledge and Understanding when their Slaves were apprehended, and by whom, and whether they might be wrongfully taken up, or not; and that the Keeper of the Cage, at the Delivery of any Slaves, do take a Receipt of the Perfon to whom delivered, and there infert the Mark or Description of the Slave delivered.

AND whereas divers evil and ill-disposed Persons have hitherto attempted to fteal away Slaves by fpecious Pretence of promifing them Freedom in another Country, against which pernicious Practices no Punishment suitable hath been yet provided; Be it therefore Enacted and Ordained by the Authority aforefaid, That what Perfon foever shall directly or indirectly, at any time after Publication hereof, tempt or perfwade any Negroes or other Slaves to leave their Masters or Mistreffes Service to whom they are Slaves, out of an Intent and Defign to carry away any of them off this Island, or to conceal or entertain any of them upon this Island, or howfoever to defraud the faid Mafters or Mistreffes of them, and be thereof convicted by their own Confession, or the Oath of One credible witnefs, shall be by the Two next Justices of the Peace where the injured Perfon lives, whereof One to be of the Quorum, adjudged to pay the Master of the faid Negro or other Slave Five and twenty Pounds Sterling, to be levied as in the cafe of Servants Wages : But in cafe the Party offending shall not be found worth Lands, Goods, or Chattels, to the Value aforefaid, then shall the Justice, for so long time as will recompense the Party injured for the Twenty five Pounds aforefaid, adjudge him Servant for Five Years to the Party injured, and fo deliver him over to him, and make a Record thereof : But if any Man shall fo tempt and practife with any Perfons, Negroes, or other Slaves, and them actually fo attempted, convey away, or fend off the Island, and be after apprehended and convicted for the fame in this Island, he shall be, by the Two next Justices of the Peace, as aforefaid, condemned to pay the Owner of fuch Negro or other Slave, Three times the Value of him or them, and Execution for the fame from the Two Justices to iffue accordingly, as in the cafe of Servants Wages: And if the Perfon fo offending has no Eftate, then he shall be ordered by the Justices to ferve the Party injured, as aforefaid.

AND whereas many heinous and grievous Crimes, as Murders, Burglaries, Robbing in the High-ways, Rapes, Burning of Houfes or Canes, be many times committed by Negroes and other Slaves, and many times malicioufly attempted by them to be committed, in which, though by divers Accidents they are prevented, yet are their Crimes neverthelefs heinous, and therefore deferve the like Punifhment; and alfo do many times fteal wilfully, kill, maim, or deftroy One or more Horfes, Mares, Geldings, Cattle, Sheep, or other Quick or Dead thing of the like Nature, and of the Value of Twelve Pence or above: And many times by attempting to fteal from the Inhabitants of this Ifland, Stock, and other Goods before mentioned, of above or under the Value aforefaid, do put fuch Inhabitants, or fome of his Family in Terror, Dread, and Jeopardy of their Lives, which feveral Offenders for danger of Efcape are not long to be imprifoned, and being brutifh Slaves, deferve not, for the Bafenefs

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of their Condition, to be tried by the legal Tryal of Twelve Men of their Peers or Neighbourhood, which neither truly can be rightly done as the Subjects of England are, nor is Execution to be delayed towards them, in cafe of fuch horrid Crimes committed : It is therefore Enacted and Ordained by the Authority aforefaid, That when any fuch Crime, as aforefaid, shall be committed, or attempted to be committed, by any Negroes, Slave or Slaves, and the faid Criminals be apprehended and brought before any of His Majefty's Justices of the Peace within this Island, and the Justices before whom the Criminals are brought, shall take Security for their Forth-coming, or fend them to Prison, and with all convenient Speed shall joyn with him the next Juffice of the Peace; and thefe Two shall, by their Warrant or Precept, call to them Three able, good, and legal Free-holders of the Place nearest where the faid Crimes were committed, and these Five Persons, viz. the Two Juflices and the Three Free-holders, shall hear and examine all Evidences, Proofs and Teftimonies, or by violent Circumstances they shall find fuch Negro, or other Slave or Slaves, guilty thereof, they fhall give Sentence of Death upon them accordingly, the faid Free-holders being first Sworn before the Two Juflices, who are hereby impowered to administer the fame, and forthwith by their Warrant caufe Execution to be done upon fuch Negro or Negroes, Slave or Slaves, by fome Negro to be preffed for that purpose by fome Constable to be appointed by Warrant from the faid Juffices.

I T is further Provided, That if any Free-holder shall make Default to appear upon fuch Summons before the Justices as is before mentioned, or appearing, refuse to joyn with them, as is before appointed, and do shew no Cause for such Default, to be approved by the faid Justices, then the aforesaid Justices do set a Fine upon him of Fisty Shillings Sterling, forthwith by their Warrant or Precept to the next Constable, or what Constable they shall think fit, to levy the fame upon the faid Free-holders, their Goods or Chattels accordingly. And if any Person shall fend off his Negro that hath killed another, he shall pay unto the Master of such Negro the Value of such Negro so killed, as aforesaid.

AND in regard great Mifchiefs daily happen by the Petty Larcenies, committed alfo by the Negroes and Slaves of this Ifland, Be it therefore Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Negro or other Slave shall hereafter steal or destroy any Goods, Chattels, and Provisions, Canes, or green Corn whatfoever, of any other Perfons than his Master's or Mistrefs's, being under the Value of Twelve Pence, every Negro or other Slave fo offending, and being brought before fome Juffice of the Peace of this Ifland, upon Complaint of the Party injured, and shall be adjudged guilty by Confession, Proof, or probable Circumstances, such Negro or Slave so offending (excepting Children, whose Punishment is left wholly to the Discretion of the faid Justice) shall be adjudged by fuch Juffice to be publickly and feverely whipped, not exceeding Forty Lashes; and the faid Justice shall order and cause the Owner of fuch Negro or other Slave to make Satisfaction to the Party injured; and if fuch Negro or other Slave, punished, as aforefaid, be afterwards found guilty of the like Crimes aforefaid, under the Value of Twelve Pence, as aforefaid, he or they, for fuch his or their fecond Offence, shall, by Order of the Justice of Peace before whom fuch Complaint and Proof is made, have his or their Nofes flit, and be branded in the Forehead with a hot Iron, that the Mark thereof may remain; and the faid Juftices shall order the Owner of fuch Negro or other Slave to make Satisfaction to the Party injured, double the Value of what his Lofs shall appear : And if such Negro or other Slave after the fecond time, as aforefaid, be accufed of Petty Larceny, or of any of the Offences before mentioned, fuch Negro or other Slave shall be tried in fuch manner as Murder, Burglary, Gc. are provided for to be tried; and if fuch Negro or other Slave as shall be tried, shall be found guilty a third time of any the Offences Offences afore-mentioned, then fuch Negro or other Slave for that third Offence, Ihall be adjudged to fuffer Death, in the manner as is appointed in Cafes of Murder, as aforefaid, or other Punifhments as the faid Juffices Ihall think fit. And in cafe the faid Juffices and Free-holders, and any or either of them, Ihall neglect or refuse to perform the Duties by this Act required of them, they Ihall feverally, for fuch their respective Defaults, forfeit the juft Sum of Five and twenty Pounds Sterling.

A N D it is further Enacted, Ordained, and Published by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Negroes or other Slaves shall make Mutiny or Infurrection, or rife in Rebellion against this Place or People, or make Preparation of Arms, Powder, Bullets, or Offensive Weapons, or hold any Council or Conspiracy of, or raising Mutiny or Rebellion against this Island, as hath been formerly attempted, that then, for speedy Remedy thereos, the Governor of the Island, or Superior Officer for the time being, appoint a Colonel, and the Field Officers of the Regiment of this Island, or any Four of them, to meet in Council, and proceed by the Martial Law against the Actors, Contrivers, Raisers, Fomenters, and Concealers of such Mutiny or Rebellion, and them punish by Death or other Pains, as their Crimes shall deferve, as to the aforesaid Colonel and Field Officers, or any Four of them, thall feem fit.

Now forafmuch as the Lofs of the Negroes and other Slaves that fhall fuffer Death by this Act, would prove fo heavy for the Owner of them only to bear, and that the Owners of Negroes may not be discouraged to detect and discover the Offences of their Negroes, and that the Lofs may be born by the Publick, whole Safety by fuch Punishments is hereby provided for and intended; Be it Enacted and Ordained by the Authority aforefaid, That in all Cafes whatfoever, where any Negro or other Slave, by the Appointment and Provision of this Act, shall suffer Death, then shall such justices and Free-holders, Colonel and Field Officers, who adjudged fuch Negro or other Slave to fuffer Death, immediately after Sentence thereof given, enquire by the best Means they are able, of the Value of fuch Negro or other Slave, in which Value they shall never exceed the Sum of Five and twenty Pounds Sterling for any One Negro or other Slave, and alfo the Damage of the Party injured, and make Certificate thereof to the Treasurer for the time being, therein requiring the faid Treasurer to pay out of the Value of the faid Negro or Negroes, the Value of the Damage to the Party injured, and the Overplus, if any be, to the Owner or Owners of fuch Negro or other Slaves; and if there be no Party injured, then the whole Value to the Owner or Owners of the faid Negroes or other Slaves; and if there be no Party injured, then the whole Value of the Danger or Dangers of the faid Negro or other Slave out of the Publick Treafury of this Island.

But in regard there are fome Masters and Owners of Negroes and other Slaves in this Ifland, who do not make fufficient Confcience of providing what is neceffary for their Negroes or other Slaves, or allowing them time to plant or provide for themfelves; for which Caufe fuch Negroes or other Slaves are neceffitated to commit Crimes contrary to the Law; and yet the Safety of this Illand requiring, that fuch Negroes and other Slaves shall fuffer as the Law hath appointed, rather than the poor Inhabitants of this Island be ruined, and driven from hence by their means: That therefore fuch Masters and Owners of Negroes and other Slaves, whofe Neglect of Negroes and other Slaves makes them in fome meafure guilty of their Crimes, may not be countenanced therein at the Charge of the Publick, Be it hereby further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the Juffices and Free-holders appointed, as aforefaid, to enquire into the Value of fuch Negro or other Slave as they shall fentence to Death, shall also further enquire, by Witnesses examined on their Oaths, or by their good Information, how the Owner or Owners of fuch Negro or other Slave condemned, as aforefaid, was provided with Provision and

and other Necessfaries, and what Allowances those Negroes and other Slaves had received: And if it shall appear to the faid Justices and Free-holders, or the major part of them, that the faid Master or Owner had not provided reafonably, and as is generally accustomed for Negroes and other Slaves, and that Neceffity might have compelled the faid Negro or other Slave to the Offences they have committed, then, and in that cafe, the Justices and Free-holders, as aforefaid, shall certifie the same to the Treasurer aforefaid, and only appoint the faid Treasurer to pay the Damage to the Party injured out of the Value of the faid Negro or other Slave, and nothing to fuch Mafter or Owner: And if the Treasurer for the time being (having fufficient Publick Stock in his Hands) Inall fail to make Satisfaction and Payment to fuch Mafter or Owner of any Negro or other Slave, he having the Governor's Warrant for the fame, the Party injured shall have an Action of Debt, upon such Certificate, as aforefaid, against the faid Treasurer in the Court of Common-Pleas for the Precincts of St. Michael's, Gc. And the Treasurer being thereto duly fummoned, shall, at the first Court after Summons, plead and come to Tryal, or elfe Judgment to pass against him by Default; and after Judgment, Execution immediately to iffue for Satisfaction.

AND in regard the Planters Necessity doth compel them, for the Management only of their Lands, to keep fo vaft a Stock of Negroes and other Slaves, whole defperate Lives and great Numbers become dangerous to them, and all other the Inhabitants; that therefore fuch who are not bound up by that Neceffity in having Plantations of their own, and hired Land, may not increase the Danger to this Ifland, by keeping Negroes or other Slaves to hire out to others, Be it therefore Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That no Perfon of the Hebrew Nation refiding in any Sea-Port Town of this Ifland, fhall keep or employ any Negro or other Slave, be he Man or Boy, for any Ule or Service whatfoever, more than One Negro or other Slave, Man or Boy, to be allowed to each of the Perfons of the faid Nation, except fuch as are denizen'd by His Majefty's Letters Patents, and not otherwife, who are to keep no more than for their own Ufe, as shall be approved by the Governor, Council, and Affembly : And if any Negro, Man or Boy, more than is before allowed by this Act, shall be found Three Months after Publication hereof, in the Custody, Poffeffion, or Ufe of any the Perfons aforefaid, then every fuch Perfon or Perfons shall forfeit such Negro or other Slave; one Moiety of the Value thereof to whomfoever thall inform, and the other Moiety to His Majefty, to the Uses in this Act appointed.

AND whereas divers Negroes and other Slaves at this prefent are, and have been long fince run away into Woods and other Faftneffes of this Island, doing continually much Mifchief to the Inhabitants of this Ifland, hiding themfelves fometimes in one Place, and fometimes in another, fo that they are not to be found without much Difficulty; Be it therefore Enacted, That from and after Publication hereof, it shall and may be lawful for any Justice of the Peace, Constable, or Captain of a Company, within this Island, that shall have Notice of the Refidency or Hiding-place of any Run-away Negroes, or other Fugitive Slaves, to raife and arm any number of Men, not exceeding Twenty, to apprehend and take them, either alive or dead. And for every Negro or other Slave that they shall take alive, having run away above Six Months from his Mafter, they fhall receive Fifty Shillings Sterling; and for every Negro or other Slave that they fhall take alive, having been run away above Twelve Months, Five Pounds from the Mafter or Commanders of the faid Negro or other Slave; if killed in taking, they shall receive Fifty Shillings Sterling from the Publick; any Act or Statute heretofore to the contrary notwithftanding.

AND

AND it is further Enacted and Ordained by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Negro or other Slave under Punishment by his Master, or his Order, for running away, or any other Crimes or Misdemeanors towards his faid Master, unfortunately shall suffer in Life or Member, which seldom happens, no Perfon whatfoever shall be liable to any Fine therefore : But if any Man fhall of Wantonness, or only of Bloody-mindedness, or Cruel Intention, wilfully kill a Negro or other Slave of his own, he shall pay into the Publick Treafury Fifteen Pounds Sterling; but if he shall so kill another Man's, he fhall pay to the Owner of the Negro, double the Value, and into the Pub-lick Treasury, Twenty five Pounds Sterling; and he shall further, by the next Juffice of the Peace, be bound to the good Behaviour during the Pleafure of the Governor and Council, and not be liable to any other Punishment or Forfeiture for the fame; neither is he that kills another Man's Negro or other Slave by Accident, liable to any other Penalty but the Owners Action at Law. But if any poor fmall Free-holder or other Perfon kill a Negro or other Slave by Night, out of the Road or Common Path, and stealing, or attempting to fteal his Provision, Swine, or other Goods, he shall not be accountable for it; any Law, Statute, or Ordinance to the contrary notwithftanding.

A N D be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all the Fines and Forfeitures arifing by this Act, fhall be to His Majefty for the Ufe of this Island, according to fuch Ufes and Proportion that in the aforefaid Claufes are respectively appointed; and fuch thereof as are not otherwife limited and appointed in this Act, as are above the Sum of Five Pounds Sterling, fhall be recovered by Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record within this Island; and fuch as are of the Sum aforefaid, or under, shall be recovered before any Justice of the Peace within this Island, who is hereby required to grant Execution for the fame, as in the cafe of Servants Wages; provided the fame be commenced within Thirty Days after the fame be forfeited.

AND Lastly, To the intent this Act, and every Clause and Branch thereof, may receive full Execution, and no Person plead Ignorance therein, It is Enacted and Ordained by the Authority aforesaid, That this Act be read and published in all the respective Parish-Churches in this Island the First Sunday in February, and the First Sunday in August, in every Year ensuing.

AND be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all Acts heretofore made concerning or any ways relating to the Governing of Negroes, Enacted before the Date of this Act, shall be Repealed, and are hereby Repealed to all Intents and Purposes whatfoever.
